18 Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

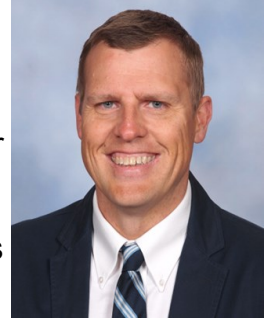

Music Instrumental Tuition

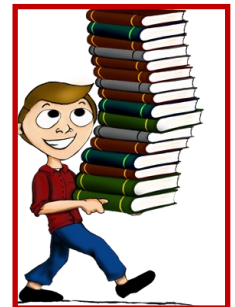
Application forms for piano (Pre-Primary to Year 6), violin (Pre-Primary to Year 6) and guitar (Year 3 to Year 6) can be obtained

Welcome back to Term 3, and what a very busy and exciting term we have in the library. In week 6 we will host our annual book fair. This year's theme, by The Children's Book Council of Australia, is 'Australia Story Country' and we

hope to celebrate and indulge in this with lots of reading and activities, by using new and old books by Australian authors.

There will be more on this in the next few weeks but please put the following dates in your diary as this year there is a slight change in that I will also be offering a parent/care givers invitation to view and pre-order books prior to the actual opening. This will also assist those parents who wish to pay online via Scholastics loop facility and then either collect the books in person or I can send home with their child. Of course, cash and credit card will be available, but the "on-line" approach for purchases is now another option available at LWLC. The pre-order/parent viewing will be Wednesday 17 August and Thursday 18 August from 3.00-3:30pm in the library.

Cleanaway Incursion -On Monday, all students from Years 1-6 participated in an incursion to promote and develop an understanding of the need to Reduce, Recycle, Reuse and Recover. This was led by Vivienne Fepuleai from Cleanaway. It was a highly informative session and will be followed up next Monday. All participating students were given fact sheets and a survey to take home. All students who have returned their surveys by next Monday will receive a free mini wheelie bin.

The Ned Show -Students will be taking part in The Ned Show on Thursday 4 August in the MPB at 9.00am. This is a character education programme that centres around three important messages that have lifelong relevance; **Never give up, Encourage others and Do your best.** A flyer has been sent home today with all students. Yoyos will be available for purchase in the office from Friday.

Late Arrivals- It is important that students arrive on time at the start of each day. School starts at 8.35am but doors are opened to classrooms, for students, from 8.20am. This is the time that notices are given out and the day is outlined to the students. Some classes even have early morning reading sessions. Devotion, a vital aspect of our day, takes place during this time and provides a good foundation for the day. If your child is late, it is important that s/he is signed in at the office. This is a safety issue as the roll book needs to accurately reflect the students attending school. Students who are late are marked as having a half day absence.
