Allergy Awareness-

A reminder that we are an 'Allergy Aware' school. We have a number of students who have allergic reactions



to a range of things, including some food items, some of them being severe and could be life threatening. It is important that no nuts are brought into school. This includes in lunchboxes and for birthday celebrations. Please check the ingredients and, if in doubt, talk to the class teacher. We also have students who are allergic to other food items so please check with your child's class teacher before bringing in

items to share.



Sun Smart- Just a reminder, as we are heading towards Spring and Summer, we are a Sun Smart school

and, as such, have a policy of 'No Hat, No Play'. Please ensure that your child has their hat at school each day, otherwise play will be restricted to on the benches in the shade.

With the onset of spring and summer approaching, it is important that students have access to sunscreen. We are using two brands of Sunscreen at present in school; 'Beauty Care' SPF 50+ and 'Cancer Council Everyday Sunscreen' SPF 30+. If your child is sensitive to either of these brands and you would not like them to have access to them, please ensure that you provide your child with their own sunscreen. It is essential for all sports lessons and outside activities.



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SUMMER UNIFORM-The summer uniform commences on the first day of Term 4. Please check your child's summer uniform to see if it still fits. All items are now available at the Uniform Shop in both new and second hand. Girls are reminded that the length of their dress is to the top of their knees.
